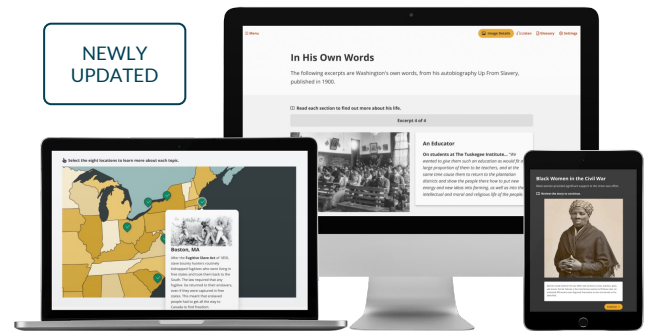

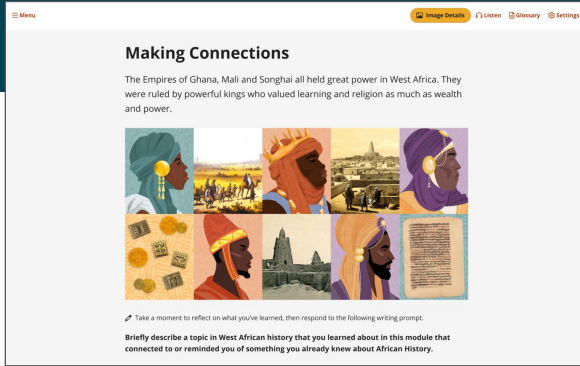

# Bring History to Life With Immersive and Engaging Digital Lessons



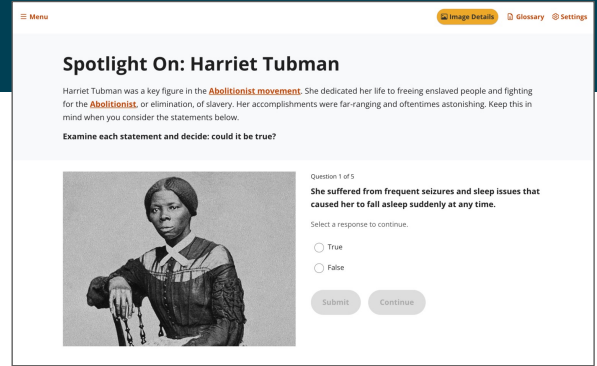

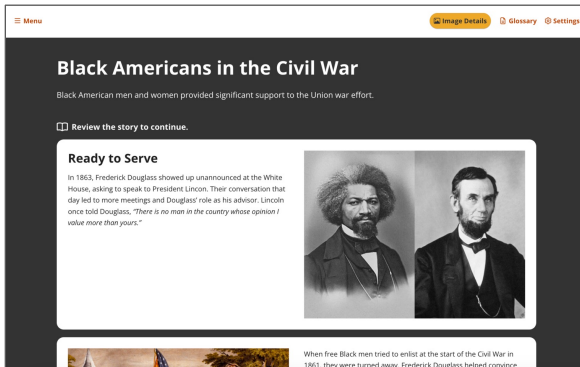
## West Africa in the Age of Global Transformations

Students explore the kingdoms of West Africa prior to the year 1600 CE. The structure of governments and agricultural production are also examined.



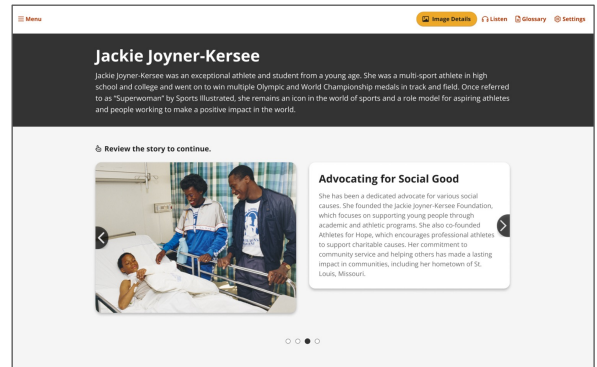
## Slavery in the United States
